



# Homeowners' Exemption program provides property tax savings

The Los Angeles County Assessor's Office Homeowners' Exemption (HOX) program reduces the assessed value of a home or condo by \$7,000 for tax purposes, which translates to a reduction of \$70 annually to a homeowner's property tax bill.

The property must be the owner's principal place of residence as of January 1, and an application must be submitted in order for a homeowner to qualify. Applications received after February 15 are prorated for that year, but the homeowner will receive the full amount the following years. The savings will continue until a change is recorded.

#### Cerritos Library offers new eBook service

Cerritos Library cardholders can now access eBooks for All California, a collection of more than 40,000 eBooks and audiobooks. This free service offers fiction and non-fiction materials for all ages and is made possible by the California State Library.

The collection's fiction categories include Classics, Comics & Graphic Novels, Historical Fiction, Mystery, Romance and Thriller. Non-fiction categories include Art & Design, Biography & Memoir, Personal Finance & Business, Food & Health, History, Reference & Study Aids and Travel.

The collection can be accessed through The Palace Project app. To access the app, visit the app store (on iOS or Android) and search for The Palace Project. Install and open the app and search for Cerritos Library. You will then need to enter your Cerritos Library card barcode number and PIN. You can then browse all the titles of eBooks or audiobooks in the collection, check out titles and begin reading or listening.

The Palace App will support the latest version of Android operating systems and the two previous OS versions. Android devices supported include phones and tablets. The Palace App will support the latest version of iOS (on iPhone or iPad) and the two previous iOS versions.

Chromebooks and Fire OS are not supported by

The Palace Project app. The devices and operating systems listed below will not work with the Palace app:

- Any Android devices running an operating system older than Android 5.0
- Nook HD/HX+, Nook Tablet, Nook Color
- Older Kindle Fire phones and tablets, Kindle Paperwhite
- Kobo e-readers

eBooks for All California includes the California State Library Palace Marketplace collection, the Palace Bookshelf of open materials and the California Enki BiblioBoard collection. The loan period varies from 21 days to perpetual use. Palace Bookshelf/Feedbooks/Standard Ebooks titles are all simultaneous and perpetual use titles that never need to be returned. The checkout timeframe is displayed in the app on the book details page after the item has been checked out and downloaded (underneath where it says Read and Return). If the title has a set checkout period, the ebook or audiobook will automatically return.

Books that have the one user at a time type of licensing model can be reserved if all copies are checked out.

### Groundwater remediation project planned at Civic Center parking structure

The Cerritos City Council recently authorized a budget amendment for the appropriation of funds in the amount of \$1,645,000 from the General Fund for groundwater remediation at the Civic Center, and awarded a \$3,022,510 contract to Mehta Mechanical Co., Inc. of La Palma for the groundwater remediation project.

The project includes constructing a wet well, two lift stations, several manholes, new sewer lines and structural improvements in an effort to divert groundwater extracted from the Civic Center parking structure to the sanitary sewer system. Tiles in the structure's stairwells will also be replaced and stairwell shade structures added. A canopy will be

constructed to aid in the diversion of rainwater.

The project also includes the construction of a four-inch sewer pipe and flow meter at the Cerritos Center for the Performing Arts to assist in de-watering the subterranean orchestra pit by discharging collected groundwater to the existing sewer line.

The total cost of the project is eligible for funding through the City's Measure W local return. Known as the "Safe, Clean Water Program," Measure W provides dedicated funding to increase local water supply, improve water quality and protect public health. In Cerritos, the Measure W local return is estimated at \$970,000 annually and must be used toward water-quality programs and projects.

#### Contracts awarded for CCPA roof replacement

The Cerritos City Council has awarded contracts related to the replacement of the roof at the Cerritos Center for the Performing Arts.

A \$2,485,773 contract was issued to Letner Roofing Company to replace the roof in certain areas of the building and install a high-performance coating system with a 15-year manufacturer's guarantee.

BEAM Professionals of Costa Mesa was awarded a \$170,000 professional services contract for

construction administration and inspection services for the project.

The original designer of the CCPA tile roof, artist April Grieman, was retained to assist in the review and selection of the color palette for the roof. Grieman will be paid \$7,000 for her services.

The City Council authorized a budget amendment for the appropriation of \$323,643 from the CCPA Endowment Fund toward the roof project. ■

#### IN-N-OUT COVER TO COVER READING PROGRAM

The In-N-Out Cover to Cover reading program is back! Children will receive an award of a certificate for one free hamburger or cheeseburger for every five books read, up to three awards! Children between the ages of 4 and 12 with a Cerritos Library Beanstack account and a valid library card are eligible to participate. If the child is not able to read on their own, their parent may read to them.

Children will use Beanstack to log their reading, either through the app or the website. Children must read and log five books to earn each digital badge (the badge will turn from black-and-white to color once the goal is met). When children earn a badge, they qualify for a Cover to Cover Achievement Award certificate, which can be redeemed for an In-N-Out hamburger or cheeseburger. Children may earn up to three badges and can receive a maximum of three Achievement Award certificates (one per week), while supplies last. The Cover to Cover Program kicks off on Monday, October 3 and will run through Monday, November 7.

#### Hand Fans, Artifacts of History Exhibition

The Cerritos Library will host an exhibition of hand-held fans from the collection of Tracy Winkler. The hand fans have been collected from around the world and cover a time period from the 1850s to the present day. The exhibition includes a wide variety of fans from Asia, Spain, Europe and the Americas. On display are examples of fixed, folding, cockade and brisè fans. ### Tips to stay safe on Halloween

For a safe and fun Halloween, follow these tips:

- If you forgo door-to-door trick-or-treating, consider attending the City's Halloween Festival from 5 to 9 p.m. on Monday, October 31 at the Los Cerritos Center.
- Your children's costumes should be fire-retardant and non-restrictive to allow free movement and uninhibited vision. Masks should not hinder a child's breathing.
- Provide adequate warm clothing under the costume to protect against cold weather if necessary.
- Always remain in familiar territory.
- When going door-to-door, travel in groups with at least one responsible adult.
- Use flashlights, "Glo-sticks" or lighted wands to help you see and be seen.
- If a home does not have a porch light turned on, the residents likely do not want to be disturbed.
- Use discretion in determining which homes children should approach.
- Obey all pedestrian traffic laws. Cross at intersections and consider the existing street lighting. Keep the group together; kids can get caught up in the excitement and may run ahead of the group.
- Carefully inspect all items received before anything is eaten. Throw away treats that are not securely wrapped by the manufacturer.
- Consider only eating candied apples or other homemade treats if you know the person who prepared them.
- If you will be passing out candy, secure pets, remove all obstructions from the path to your porch and avoid using any open flame near the door.

### Holiday lights permitted for Diwali

Holiday lights and decorations are permitted in the City to celebrate the Diwali holiday. No commercial messages may be displayed and the lights and decorations must be removed within 15 days after the holiday. The five-day Diwali holiday falls between mid-October and mid-November.

#### City of Cerritos COVID-19 update

Please note that the following information is current as of September 20.

At press time, the County was reporting a total of 11,747 cases of COVID-19 in Cerritos and 88 deaths due to COVID-19. There were 176 reported cases of COVID-19 and two deaths in the unincorporated area of Cerritos. This represents an increase of 436 cases and zero deaths in Cerritos since the September issue of "The Cerritos News."

#### Short-term rentals banned in Cerritos

Cerritos residential property owners are reminded that the City of Cerritos prohibits short-term rentals.

Short-term rentals refer to leasing or renting a single-family residential dwelling unit (in whole or in part) for 31 days or fewer. The most common types of short-term rentals are vacation rentals and home-sharing rentals, which are both prohibited. The Sheraton Cerritos Hotel located in the commercially zoned Cerritos Towne Center is not considered a shortterm rental under the ordinance.

The ban strives to protect Cerritos residential neighborhoods from the noise, nuisances, added traffic and other adverse factors that can arise with short-term rentals. Appropriate enforcement measures will be taken against those who violate the City ordinance.
