CCPA features David Foster and more in April

The Cerritos Center for the Performing Arts (CCPA) offers the following exciting musical acts in April.

Spend “An Intimate Evening With David Foster & Katharine McPhee” on Saturday, April 8 at 8 p.m. This concert was rescheduled from Saturday, March 4. Music producer-songwriter Foster has won 16 Grammys and an Emmy. The Golden Globe winner is the mastermind behind Kenny Loggins’ smash hit “Forever,” Chicago’s “Hard to Say I’m Sorry” and Celine Dion’s “Because You Loved Me.” “American Idol” fan favorite McPhee has hits that include “Over It” and “Had It All.” Tickets to see the powerhouse husband-and-wife team start at \$90.

Join the fun when “Rockin’ at the Beach” hits the shores of Cerritos on Saturday, April 15 at 8 p.m.! All-time favorite entertainer Frankie Avalon charmed generations of fans with a litany of hits, including

“Venus,” “Why,” “Bobby Sox” and “DeDe Dinah.” The show also features Dean Torrence of the Surf-Rock duo Jan and Dean (“Dead Man’s Curve,” “Little Old Lady From Pasadena” and “Surf City”) and The Surf City All Stars band. Tickets start at \$65.

Keiko Matsui, who lit up “Billboard’s” Jazz charts with the albums “Sapphire,” “Dream Walk” and “Echo,” returns to Cerritos on Saturday, April 29 at 8 p.m. Her latest album is “Euphoria.” Matsui’s unique musical formula blends Asian and Western influences, making her one of “Billboard’s” No. One female Contemporary Jazz figures and a two-time recipient of the Oasis Award for “Best Female Smooth Jazz Artist of the Year.” Matsui’s concert will feature special guest saxophonist Kirk Whalum. Tickets start at \$40.

City Council awards contract for flooring replacement in Council Chambers

The Cerritos City Council recently awarded a contract to Commercial Interior Resources (CIR) of Irvine in the amount of \$63,912.10 to replace carpet flooring throughout the City Council Chambers. The Council Chambers is approximately 45 years old and is currently undergoing improvements and audio and visual system upgrades.

The flooring work is expected to begin in July. CIR recently completed flooring for the Cerritos Library. ■

Keystone Plaza to be remodeled

The Cerritos City Council recently approved plans to remodel the exterior buildings and make other related site improvements at the Keystone Plaza shopping center at 13201-13223 South Street.

Built in 1977, the shopping center upgrades will include repainting both buildings in an earth-tone color scheme of browns, beiges and muted greens. The existing roof will be replaced with a brown-colored, mission tile roof to blend with the proposed color scheme.

The Craftsman design theme consists of wood siding and stucco-wrapped columns with a stacked stone wainscot and decorative cap. It also features tower elements with decorative wood roof supports that are held up by stone-covered columns. New light sconces will illuminate the building and surrounding walkways.

Keystone Plaza property owners have retained Matson Architects to perform the redesign and upgrades. Construction is expected to begin in the summer, with two phases. ■

The project consists of demolishing the existing vacant Target garden center, and the construction of a new drive-through building. New landscaping and a new parking area will be installed.

Construction is expected to begin in the coming months. ■

Registration now open for opportunity to purchase City-owned senior affordable housing unit

The City of Cerritos is pleased to announce the availability of three City-owned affordable senior condominium units in the gated community Emerald Villas for purchase through a lottery process. Two units are currently available for purchase, and one unit will be available soon.

The Emerald Villas community is located on Carmenita Road and Houston Avenue. Prospective buyers must meet the community's age restriction of 62 years of age or older and be a U.S. citizen or a U.S. permanent resident. They cannot own any additional property and must meet income requirements. A one-person household cannot exceed \$41,700 gross annual income for the very-low income units or \$76,500 for the moderate-income unit. A two-person household's gross annual income must be less than \$47,650 for the very low income units or less than \$87,450 for the moderate income unit.

All built in 1999, two of the condos are one bedroom, one bath; the third unit is a two bedroom, two

bath home. They all come with a one-car garage and range from 733 to 1,001 square feet. Estimated prices will range from \$100,000 to \$250,000. Tours will be offered only to qualified and verified applicants selected by way of the lottery.

The units must be owner-occupied and cannot be rented out. Only the approved low-income senior may live in the unit; children or other family members who have not been approved by the City are not permitted to live permanently in the unit.

Lottery registration forms are available at Cerritos City Hall (18125 Bloomfield Avenue, Cerritos) and on the City's website at cerritos.us. Completed forms must be submitted in-person to City Hall by 5 p.m. on Friday, April 28. Residents can submit only one form.

The lottery to select the prospective homeowners will be held at or before a City Council meeting following the registration period. All potential buyers picked in the lottery will be required to undergo a compliance review for qualifications. ■

Be cautious of coyotes in Cerritos

Residents are advised to take the following precautions to avoid encounters with coyotes:

- Feed pets indoors.
- Eliminate potential food and water sources, such as fallen fruit or standing water.
- Keep yards free of thick brush and weeds.
- Enclose the bottoms of porches and decks.
- Keep dogs on a leash at all times when outdoors.
- Keep small animals inside or supervised when outdoors. A fenced yard will not protect small animals because coyotes can easily scale residential fences. Domestic dogs are especially vulnerable to coyote attacks. Adult coyotes are mainly active at night or

Residential organic waste recycling program in effect

The City's new residential organic waste recycling program expands the list of items to be placed in your green trash cart to include both green waste and food waste. Below are lists of acceptable items to now dispose in your green cart.

Green Waste

- Flower and hedge trimmings
- Grass clippings
- Leaves and branches
- Lumber, scrap wood and plywood (not painted or treated)
- Weeds

Food Scraps

- Bread, rice and pasta
- Cheese and dairy
- Coffee grounds and filters
- Fruits and vegetables
- Flowers and herbs
- Meat, bones and poultry
- Seafood and soft shells
- Pet food (non-medicated)

Food-Soiled Paper

(Must be 100 percent fiber-based. No materials with petroleum-based plastic, wax or bioplastic coating, liner or laminate.)

- Food-stained paper
- Paper egg cartons
- Paper napkins and kitchen paper towels
- Pizza boxes
- Plates

- To-go boxes (no coating)
- Wood and fiber-based utensils

Unacceptable Items for Green Cart

- All plastics
- Cacti, succulents and yucca
- Compostable plastics (bioplastics)
- Coffee cups and pods
- Fats, oils and grease
- Food stickers (please remove from items)
- Gloves
- Hard shells (clams, mussels, oysters)
- Medication
- Palm fronds
- Paper napkins and paper towels with cleaning chemicals
- Parchment and wax paper
- Pet waste
- Rocks and soil
- Rubber bands and twist ties
- Tea bags
- Textiles
- Tissues and wet wipes

Under Senate Bill 1383, organic waste recycling programs must now accept both green waste and food waste. Approved in 2016, SB 1383 requires jurisdictions to provide organic-waste collection services to all businesses and residents. The bill aims to drastically reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 2025.

South Street sewer to be repaired

The Cerritos City Council recently awarded a contract to Torres Sanitation Systems Construction in the amount of \$95,000 to replace sections of the South Street sewer east of Pioneer Boulevard. The sewer line serves the Lincoln Station shopping center and other surrounding businesses.

The South Gate-based company will remove and replace deficient sewer lines, replace asphalt, conduct traffic control and perform striping necessary to complete the project.

The project is scheduled to begin in the spring. ■

Cerritos streets to be evaluated

Infrastructure Management Services (IMS) has been awarded a \$49,995 contract by the Cerritos City Council to evaluate current street conditions and update the Cerritos Pavement Management Program.

The program tracks the conditions of approximately 145 miles of concrete and asphalt concrete paved streets for the purpose of prioritizing street repairs and planning future expenditures.

IMS will perform pavement surface distress surveys, rutting and roughness surveys and deflection surveys. ■

City of Cerritos COVID-19 update

Please note that the following information is current as of March 21.

At press time, the County was reporting a total of 13,225 cases of COVID-19 in Cerritos and 105 deaths due to COVID-19. There were 192 reported cases of COVID-19 and two deaths in the unincorporated area of Cerritos. This represents an increase of 150 cases and six deaths in Cerritos since the March issue of "The Cerritos News." ■

in the early morning hours, while young coyotes are often active during the day. California coyotes have adapted to residential neighborhoods, parks and open spaces in urban and suburban areas. They are especially prevalent in areas bordering a flood channel.

Residents who see a coyote in their neighborhood should try to scare it away by shouting, throwing rocks, blowing portable air horns or acting in other aggressive ways in order to reinforce the coyote's fear of people. Motion-sensitive lights on houses or out-buildings may also deter coyotes from approaching.

If an aggressive or fearless coyote approaches you or your pet, consider the following tips:

- Shout in a deep voice.
 - Wave your arms.
 - Throw objects at the animal.
 - Look the coyote directly in the eyes.
 - Stand up if you are seated.
 - If you are wearing a coat or vest, spread it open like a cape so that you appear larger.
 - Retreat from the situation by walking backward slowly. Do not turn your back on the coyote.
- The City of Cerritos contracts with Long Beach Animal Care Services to provide a wide range of services, including coyote management. The City of

Long Beach has a comprehensive coyote management plan and that plan serves as the de facto plan for Cerritos by extension of the service contract. The majority of cities in the region all have similar coyote management plans as each plan must be in accord with the regulations established by the California Department of Fish and Wildlife.
