- Directed staff to submit a budget amendment to increase the Professional Services account in the Municipal Library cost center (110-571-61430) in the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Combined Financial Program by \$4,014.10 to cover the costs for new Study Room name signs and an online survey project; and
- Post an online survey for the community to vote for up to three names of women, including the list of women and biographical information presented in the agenda report associated with this item; and
- Promote the opportunity to vote for Study Room names through a poster displayed in the library, on the library's video wall, on the City's social media channels, in the City's newsletter and on Cerritos TV3; and
- Report back to the City Council with the results of the vote with a recommendation to rename three study Rooms after the top three vote-getters; and
- Conduct a drawing at the City Council meeting to randomly select the three Study Room men's names to be replaced; and

- Authorized the City's special counsel, Colantuono
 Highsmith & Whatley (Special Counsel), and the
 City Attorney to negotiate a settlement agreement
 that would include a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) covering specified covenants
 between Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro) and the City relating
 to the expansion of Metro's West Santa Ana Branch
 rail line into Cerritos, and authorizing the Mayor
 to sign the MOU if a signed MOU from Metro included those specified covenants. Because Cerritos

- did not have a final or signed MOU from Metro at that time, this item was not required to be reported out at the August 10, 2023 meeting, as negotiations on the settlement of the case were still pending. On August 24, 2023, Special Counsel and the City Attorney's Office received from Metro a signed Settlement Agreement and MOU from Metro, and the MOU includes the specified covenants between Metro and the City relating to the expansion of the West Santa Ana Branch rail line into Cerritos. Therefore, pursuant to the City Council's prior action, the City and Metro have reached a settlement of this case by City Council's approval of the signed MOU and Settlement Agreement. The substance of the settlement may be summarized as follows: (1) per the MOU, Metro covenants to work with the City on a future study, budget, parking requirements, and other specified covenants set forth in the MOU relating to a potential future station located in Cerritos in the vicinity of 183rd Street and Gridley Road; and (2) the City agrees to dismiss with prejudice this existing litigation, brought against Metro for alleged violations of the Public Records Act, with no party having to pay any monetary contribution to the other, each party agreeing to cover their own litigation costs, neither party admitting any liability or fault, and other standard terms and conditions for settlement.
- Authorized seeking an appeal by filing a petition for review in the California Supreme Court of the recent opinion issued by the Second District Court of Appeal. This case may be summarized as follows: The petition for writ of mandate was brought by Orange County Council of Governments (OCCOG) and several Southern California cities, including Cerritos. The writ of mandate sought to set aside the Regional Housing Needs Assessment (RHNA) allocation of 1,341,827 dwelling units, as determined by the State Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD), for the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) region, change input data, and re-calculate the SCAG regional housing need. The trial court sustained demurrers filed by HCD and SCAG, which argued that judicial review is not available under the RHNA process. Sustaining the demurrers effectively dismissed the petition, and judgment was entered in favor of HCD and SCAG, and against the petitioners. OCCOG and the several cities, including Cerritos, per prior City Council authorization, noticed an appeal of this trial court ruling. The Court of Appeal recently filed an opinion, affirming the trial court's decision. By the action taken by the City Council, Cerritos will continue to be a coappellant to the lawsuit and has authorized Special Counsel, Aleshire & Wynder LLP, to file a petition for review of the Court of Appeal opinion.

September 14, 2023

- City Manager Robert A. Lopez's benefits package will be the same as those available to the City's Department Directors, including vacation, administrative leave, and other benefits and will be carried forward upon commencement of office of City Manager;
- City Manager Robert A. Lopez's pension packages as authorized under CalPERS and PARS will remain in place and will be carried forward upon commencement of office of City Manager; and
- Other common terms and conditions relating to public agency executive employment are to be included, as agreed upon by the City Council and Robert A. Lopez.
- Announced that the City Council appointed Robert A. Lopez as the next City Manager; and
- Directed the City Attorney and Fred Wilson, of Ralph Andersen & Associates, to finalize an employment agreement for the next City Manager, subject to the terms and conditions listed above; and
- Directed Art Gallucci, current City Manager, to take appropriate actions for the transition of responsibilities and to oversee the implementation of other necessary and appropriate actions for the appointed next City Manager.
- Approved Mayor Pro Tem Naresh Solanki's nomination of Leah Nass to fill an unscheduled vacancy of an unexpired two-year term of service on the Let Freedom Ring Committee expiring April 30, 2024.
- Approved Mayor Pro Tem Naresh Solanki's nomination of Daisy Lagasca to fill an unscheduled vacancy of an unexpired two-year term of service on the Let Freedom Ring Committee expiring April 30, 2024.
- Approved Councilmember Frank Yokoyama's nomination of Al Barlevy to fill an unscheduled vacancy of an unexpired two-year term of service on the Let Freedom Ring Committee expiring April 30, 2024.
- Awarded a contract to Southern Cal Construction in the amount of \$87,050 for City Hall Security Improvements and rejected the other bids.
- Awarded a contract to Barbizon Lighting Company in the amount of \$359,263.16 for Capital Improvement Program project, Cerritos Center for the Performing Arts lighting system replacement, Project No. 24201, under the local government BuyBoard cooperative agreement as permitted by the Cerritos Municipal Code and adopted Purchasing and Contracting Policy.
- Awarded a contract to Advantage Mailing, LLC in the amount of \$45,566.09 for the printing of the 2024 Cerritos Community Calendar, Bid No. 1518-23.
- Awarded a two-year contract with provisions to extend up to three one-year extensions to Carus, LLC for supply and delivery of 70/30 blend polyorthophosphate in 55-gallon drums, Bid No. 1514-23.
