City streets to get upgrades



Street upgrades on Artesia Boulevard and Carmenita Road are currently under way.

The City Council recently awarded a \$4.8 million contract to Onyx Paving Company of Anaheim for street rehabilitation projects throughout Cerritos.

The areas that will be upgraded include 183rd Street between Carmenita Road and Marquardt Avenue; Marquardt Avenue between 183rd Street and Artesia Boulevard; 166th Street between Norwalk Boulevard and Bloomfield Avenue; and Auto Square Drive.

The scope of the work involves removing and replacing asphalt concrete, deficient concrete curb and

gutters and installing traffic signal loops, and restriping lane lines, arrows and stop bars. Onyx Paving will also replace sidewalk panels, trees and curb ramps and adjust manhole covers to grade.

The project includes installing conduits to create a secure fiber optic network aimed at connecting City facilities to support City operations along the affected sections of Carmenita Road, Marquardt Avenue and 166th Street.

The project is scheduled to begin mid-spring and conclude by the end of summer. \blacksquare
