ART OF THE BOOK: ACCORDION FOLD & COLLABORATIVE WORK BOOKS

A selection of accordion fold books and collaborative work books will be on display throughout the Library until the end of June. This display of books is one of the ongoing exhibits showcasing the unique pieces from the Library's special collection of artists' books.

OIL PAINTINGS BY JUNG SOOK HYUN

A display of oil paintings depicting the beauty of nature by award-winning Korean artist Jung Sook Hyun will be on display in the Local History Museum until the end of June.

JAPANESE NINGYO

This colorful display in the Library's lobby focuses on three categories of ningyo dolls, including ichimatsu ningyo (dolls depicting young Japanese children), musha ningyo (dolls depicting heroic warriors) and isho ningyo (dolls of folk culture). The dolls were purchased from temples around Osaka, Kobe and Kyoto by Noelle Spsychala. The dolls will be displayed until the end of June.

HISTORY OF GAMING

A variety of gaming consoles from the 1970s through 2000 will be on display in the Young Adult area of the Library until the end of June. These items, which include a variety of Sega and Nintendo systems, are from the collections of Allen Montgomery and other Library staff members.
