CCPA announces 25th anniversary season lineup

Motown “Empress of Soul” Gladys Knight opens the 25th anniversary season at the Cerritos Center for the Performing Arts (CCPA) on Saturday, September 9 with a concert showcasing her greatest hits.

The 2017-2018 Season lineup boasts a diverse range of world-class performers, including comedic icons Betty White and Jay Leno, Grammy Hall of Famer Johnny Mathis, inspiring astronaut Captain Scott Kelly and Rock and Roll Hall of Famer The Beach Boys.

The award-winning 3-D Theatricals (3-DT) returns as a Broadway Performance Partner, presenting a new Broadway Series that features “Young Frankenstein,” “Million Dollar Quartet,” “Parade” and a fourth Broadway blockbuster to be announced.

Discount subscriptions are available for Rob Kapilow’s “What Makes It Great?” and the Broadway series. The popular “Choose Your Own Season” package offers theatergoers a 10-percent discount and the flexibility to customize their own season with five or more performances of their choice if orders are placed by Monday, July 31. (Performance Partner Programs are not eligible for the “Choose Your Own” package.)

The CCPA is also offering summer specials presented by 3-DT: Rodgers & Hammerstein’s “Oklahoma!” in June and Monty Python’s “Spamalot” in August.

The 44th Annual Let Freedom Ring Celebration takes place Tuesday, July 4 from 4 to 9 p.m. at the Cerritos Civic Center. The event includes rides, entertainment and a formal City Council bell-ringing ceremony. A fireworks show at 9 p.m. concludes the event. Bring a blanket or chair to view the fireworks. Barbecues and picnicking are not allowed.

All-day ride wristbands are available for \$20 before Friday, June 30. On Tuesday, July 4, the wristbands will be \$25. Individual tickets are \$1 each. The Family Pack, which includes 25 tickets, is \$20.

All northbound and southbound lanes of Bloomfield Avenue will be closed from Towne Center Drive to 183rd Street from 7 p.m. on Monday, July 3 to 2 a.m. on Wednesday, July 5. All eastbound and westbound lanes of 183rd Street will be closed from Bloomfield Avenue to Cortner Avenue from 8 to 10 p.m. on Tuesday, July 4.

The Cerritos City Council awarded a \$98,000 contract to Newbuild Construction and Restoration Inc. of Orange to partially replace the patio trellises at the Senior Center, which require ongoing maintenance.

The project is expected to be done by the end of summer. ■

Hazardous household waste roundup planned

A free household hazardous waste and e-waste roundup will be held on Saturday, July 15 at Cerritos College Stadium Parking Lot C-1. The event runs from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Sponsored by the Los Angeles County Sanitation Districts and the Department of Public Works, the Household Hazardous Waste collection program gives Los Angeles County residents the opportunity to legally dispose of unwanted household chemicals that cannot be discarded in the regular trash.

Chemicals that will be accepted include motor oil, antifreeze, paint, paint thinner, turpentine, cleaners with acids or lye, pesticides and herbicides, household and car batteries, old computers and televisions. Approved materials also include used needles, expired medication and mercury thermometers.

Explosives (with the exception of flares), ammunition and radioactive materials, trash and old tires will not be accepted. Waste from businesses will also not be accepted. Appliances such as washers, stoves, air conditioners and refrigerators are also prohibited.

Bring items in sturdy boxes, preferably in their original labeled containers, and do not mix the products together. Be prepared to leave your containers. There is a limit of 15 gallons or 125 pounds per vehicle.

Chase bank approved

The Cerritos City Council has approved a proposal to construct a Chase bank with drive-through ATM service in the Los Cerritos Center shopping mall parking lot.

The bank will be located in the space formerly occupied by Allen Tire Company, which will be demolished. The 6,480-square-foot site is located on 18801 Gridley Road.

The new Chase building will be approximately 3,470 square feet with walk-up ATMs and a detached drive-through canopy providing a single ATM. The facility will adopt the Chase bank corporate design prototype: beige exterior featuring wainscot and brick veneer.

The project is expected to be completed in Spring 2018. ■

Parking prohibited during street sweeping

Street parking in Cerritos is prohibited during specified days and times designated for street sweeping.

parking are posted at the entrances to each residential housing tract.

Violators of the ordinance are subject to a \$25 ticket for each offense. The restriction will not be enforced during weeks when there is an official holiday and City Hall is closed.

Del Amo Boulevard street improvements under way

The Cerritos City Council recently awarded a \$1,146,530 contract to Sequel Contractors, Inc. for street improvements on Del Amo Boulevard from Bloomfield Avenue to Norwalk Boulevard.

Sequel Contractors, Inc. of Santa Fe Springs will repave the streets and rehabilitate sidewalks, curbs and gutters. The project includes installation of conduit and pull boxes for potential future signal interconnect

project and IT infrastructure. Pipes and cleanouts for “Green Streets” will also be conducted. Improvements will be made to parkway landscaping and irrigation, and all lane-striping, crosswalks and legends will receive paint upgrades.

The project is expected to conclude by the end of summer. ■

Rabies clinic to be held in July

The City of Cerritos will hold a low-cost rabies clinic for dogs and cats in Shelter 1 at Cerritos Park East from 6:30 to 8 p.m. on Wednesday, July 19.

The clinic is sponsored by Long Beach Animal Care Services and Artesia Animal Hospital, in cooperation with the City of Cerritos' Community Safety and Community Participation divisions.

Rabies shots for dogs and cats will be available for \$10, and canine bordetella (kennel cough) shots cost \$17 each. Canine coronavirus vaccines are \$15, and Lyme disease vaccines will be \$23. DHPP shots, also known as the "6-in-1" vaccine that protects dogs from distemper, hepatitis, parainfluenza and parvovirus, will be available for \$19. The comparable "4-in-1" (FVRCP) shot for cats cost \$18. Feline bordetella (FIP) shots will be \$29, and feline coronavirus (FELV) shots are \$20. In addition to vaccination fees, a \$3 biohazard disposal fee will be charged for each treated animal.

Checks for vaccines should be made payable to the City of Cerritos. A driver's license number and expiration date are required on all checks. Returned checks are subject to a \$10 service fee. AVID microchipping will also be available for \$25 per cat or dog.

In addition to an annual rabies shot, dogs four months and older are required by law to have a license. Dog licenses will be sold to Cerritos, Long Beach, Los Alamitos, Seal Beach and Signal Hill residents at the clinic. Dog license fees for Cerritos residents are \$20, or \$10 for dogs that are spayed or neutered (a certificate is required to receive the discount). Seniors ages 60 and older may purchase up to three half-price licenses per household for dogs that are spayed or neutered. To obtain a license, dog owners must show a copy of a current rabies certificate, valid for 12 months, and a sterility certificate if the dog is spayed or neutered. Checks for dog licenses should be made payable to Long Beach Animal Care Services.

Pet owners must keep their dogs on leashes and cats in pet carriers during the clinic. For more information about animal licenses, call Long Beach Animal Care Services at (562) 570-7387. ■

CCPA Sierra Room roof replacement contract awarded

The Cerritos City Council recently awarded Tecta America of Santa Ana a \$497,000 contract to replace the Cerritos Center for the Performing Arts Sierra Room roof. Plump Engineering Inc./D7 Consulting, which provided the design for the roof replacement, will be paid \$45,000 to conduct periodic inspections throughout the work phase.

The project is expected to be completed in August. ■
