CCPA presents an exciting November schedule

Get ready for “happy music made by happy people.” That’s how “The New York Times” described performances by Grammy winning trumpeter Herb Alpert and his wife, singer-producer Lani Hall, who come to the Cerritos Center for the Performing Arts (CCPA) on Friday, November 3 at 8 p.m. Tickets range from \$80 to \$60.

Get down to good-time beats with the “All American Rock ‘n’ Roll Tour” on Saturday, November 4 at 8 p.m. Enjoy Vocal Group Hall of Fame band Jay and the Americans (“This Magic Moment”), Paul Revere’s Raiders (“Kicks”) and Mitch Ryder (“Devil With a Blue Dress”). Ticket prices range from \$75 to \$55.

Children and adults will be enchanted by the blend of drama, mime, dance, puppetry, juggling, contortions, sand art and magic showcasing the beauty of soap bubbles in “Underwater Bubble Show.” Don’t miss the action on Sunday, November 5 at 3 p.m. Tickets range from \$65 to \$45.

Check into the “Hotel California – A Salute to the Eagles” on Friday, November 10 at 8 p.m. Take a trip down a dark desert highway with this tribute to the six-time Grammy-winning supergroup. Tickets cost \$65 to \$35.

“The Folk Reunion” takes place at the CCPA on Saturday, November 11 at 8 p.m. Featuring a brand new lineup, The Kingston Trio will deliver many of the trio’s traditional hits (“Where Have All the Flowers Gone”) as well as new songs and stories. The special guest is singer-guitarist John Sebastian, who founded the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame group The Lovin’ Spoonful (“Do You Believe in Magic”). Tickets range from \$75 to \$40.

Rob Kapilow kicks off the CCPA 2017-2018 “What Makes It Great?” series on Wednesday, November 15 at 7:30 p.m. with “MOZART – G-minor Symphony” with the Cal State Fullerton Symphony Orchestra. Tickets are \$55. A series subscription is available for \$117.

Classic Albums Live and its roster of A-list musicians from across the country deliver Rock favorites as you remember hearing them – note for note, cut for cut. Enjoy Beatles hits at “Classic Albums Live – Abbey Road” on Friday, November 17 at 8 p.m. Tickets are \$65 to \$45.

Champions of Magic, a cast of five world-class illusionists from Britain presents incredible mind read-

ing, stunning close-up magic and daring large-scale illusions on Saturday, November 18 at 8 p.m. Tickets are \$75 to \$40. A VIP upgrade is also available for an additional \$50.

Company to process parking citations

The City of Cerritos recently entered into a one-year agreement with Citation Processing Center, for processing all parking citations issued by the City’s Parking Enforcement Detail. In July, Citation Processing Center, which currently processes code-enforcement violations for Cerritos, purchased Judicial Data Systems, Inc., which had processed parking citations for the City since 1983. The acquisition required the City to enter into a service contract with Citation Processing Center to ensure uninterrupted citations processing. The City incurs no increased costs in this transition.

Citation Processing Center employs an automated, wireless and internet-based system, which speeds up the citations processing. Cerritos Parking Enforcement Officers will be able to use handheld devices, which is expected to eliminate errors due to incomplete data or illegible penmanship. With the new company, motorists can also pay for the parking citation or file appeals online. The new system is expected to be in place by the end of October. ■

City observes November holidays

Cerritos City Hall, the City Clerk’s Office, Cerritos Library, Cerritos Senior Center at Pat Nixon Park and the Cerritos Center for the Performing Arts (CCPA) will be closed on Friday, November 10 for Veterans Day. City parks and recreation facilities will be open regular hours. Cerritos Library will also be closed on Saturday, November 11.

In observance of the Thanksgiving holiday, the Cerritos Library and the Cerritos Senior Center at Pat Nixon Park will close at 5 p.m. on Wednesday, November 22. The Cerritos Sports Complex and community gymnasiums will be open regular hours on Wednesday, November 22, and the following facilities will be open with modified hours: the Golf course will be open from 6:30 a.m. to 4 p.m.; Adult Lap Swim will be held from 7 a.m. to 2 p.m.; Recreational Swim will be held from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m.; and the Community Centers will be open from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Also in observance of the Thanksgiving holiday, the following City facilities will be closed on Thursday, November 23: City Hall, the City Clerk’s Office, the Cerritos Senior Center at Pat Nixon Park, Cerritos Library, the Cerritos Center for the Performing Arts, all Community Centers, the Community Gymnasiums at Cerritos and Whitney High Schools, the Cerritos Olympic Swim and Fitness Center and the Cerritos Sports Complex.

On Thursday, November 23, Cerritos Iron-Wood Nine Golf Course will be open from 6:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. The Cerritos Sheriff’s Station will remain open, but the Community Safety Division will be closed on Thursday, November 23 and Friday, November 24.

City Hall, the City Clerk’s Office, Cerritos Library, Cerritos Senior Center at Pat Nixon Park and the CCPA Ticket Office will remain closed on Friday, November 24; however, all park facilities will be open normal hours.

There will be no trash pick-up or street sweeping on Thanksgiving. Thursday and Friday schedules will be delayed by one day for the remainder of the week. There will be no enforcement of the street-sweeping parking restriction from Saturday, November 18 through Sunday, November 26. There will be no Cerritos on Wheels service on Thanksgiving and the day after Thanksgiving. ■

Overnight parking restrictions relaxed for holidays

Out-of-town guests visiting family and friends in Cerritos for the Thanksgiving holiday are welcome to park overnight on Cerritos streets without a permit during the City’s annual holiday parking moratorium. No parking permit will be required from Saturday, November 18 through Monday, November 27.

A holiday parking moratorium will also be in effect from Saturday, December 9 through Monday, January 8 for the Christmas and New Year’s Day holidays.

Permits are normally required to park on City streets between 3 and 5 a.m. to help keep streets clear and allow residents and deputies to quickly spot suspicious vehicles. Overnight parking permit renewals will take place beginning in mid-November.
