## Cerritos Center for the Performing Arts kicks off 2017-2018 season



**Betty White shares her stories on Sunday, September 10 at the Cerritos Center for the Performing Arts.**

The Cerritos Center for the Performing Arts (CCPA) opens the 2017-2018 Season with Grammy-winning Motown powerhouse Gladys Knight. The “Empress of Soul” – who shattered music charts with “Love Overboard,” “Neither One of Us (Wants to Be the First to Say Goodbye)” and “Midnight Train to Georgia” – performs

on Saturday, September 9 at 8 p.m. Tickets range from \$80 to \$135.

One of the funniest and busiest actresses in Hollywood, Betty White shares stories about her life and award-winning career, which includes award-winning stints on “Golden Girls” and “The Mary Tyler Moore Show.” The legendary comedienne’s talk, followed by an audience Q&A, is scheduled for Sunday, September 10 at 3 p.m. Television star Valerie Bertinelli moderates the show. Tickets cost \$75 to \$200.

“We’ve Only Just Begun: Carpenters Remembered” celebrates the Pop duo’s legacy in words and music. Accompanied by a live seven-piece band, the show pays tribute to the Carpenters’ music phenomenon and hits, such as “(They Long to Be) Close to You,” “Yesterday Once More” and “There’s a Kind of Hush.” Tickets are \$45 to \$65 for this 8 p.m. concert on Saturday, September 16.

Creedence Clearwater Revisited returns to the CCPA Sunday, September 17 at 7 p.m. The dynamic Rock group delivers its timeless songs, such as “Proud Mary,” “Down on the Corner” and “Who’ll Stop the Rain.” The group is the creation of original band members and Rock and Roll Hall of Famers Stu Cook and Doug “Cosmo” Clifford. Ticket prices range from \$80 to \$100.

A performance by Johnny Mathis on Friday, September 22 is sold out.

“Live and Let Die” features a four-piece band headed by bassist-guitarist-pianist-singer Tony Kishman and a

full symphony orchestra led by conductor Martin Herman. Enjoy hit songs from the Beatles’ catalog and Paul McCartney’s solo works, including “Let It Be,” “Live and Let Die” and “Yesterday.” Tickets range from \$45 to \$65 for the 8 p.m. performance on Saturday, September 23.

Are you ready for some “Fun, Fun, Fun” with The Beach Boys? The legendary Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, Grammy-winning band brings “Good Vibrations” to the shores of Cerritos on Sunday, September 24 at 7 p.m. The night features a treasure trove of all-time surf hits, including “California Girls,” “I Get Around” and “Barbara Ann.” Tickets are \$100 to \$120.

Eddie Money and Starship Featuring Mickey Thomas play at the CCPA on Friday, September 29 at 8 p.m. Money’s blue-collar brand of Rock ‘n’ Roll transcends generations with the hits “Two Tickets to Paradise” and the Grammy-nominated “Take Me Home Tonight.” With Thomas at its helm, Starship ruled the charts with “We Built This City” and the Oscar-nominated “Nothing Gonna Stop Us Now.” Starship performs first and Money closes the show. Ticket prices range from \$50 to \$95.

Celebrated for the hit “The Way You Look Tonight,” Emmy and Grammy winner Steve Tyrell will perform music from the Great American Songbook and songs by Ray Charles at the CCPA on Saturday, September 30 at 8 p.m. Tickets cost \$30 to \$70.

## City facilities observe Labor Day

Cerritos City Hall, the City Clerk’s Office, the Cerritos Senior Center at Pat Nixon Park, Cerritos Library, the Community Gymnasiums and the Cerritos Center for the Performing Arts Ticket Office will be closed on Monday, September 4 in observance of Labor Day.

On Monday, September 4, Cerritos Park East, Heritage Park and Liberty Park are open from 10 a.m. to 9:30 p.m. The Cerritos Iron-Wood Nine Golf Course is open from 6 a.m. to 8:30 p.m. The Cerritos Sports Complex will be open from 2 to 8 p.m. and the Cerritos Olympic Swim and Fitness Center will be closed due to maintenance.

There will be no street sweeping and trash pick-up on Labor Day. Schedules will be delayed by one day for the remainder of the week through Saturday. The COW and Dial-A-Ride transit services will not operate on Labor Day. ■

## Short-term rentals banned in Cerritos

Residents are reminded that the City of Cerritos prohibits short-term rentals. The ordinance took effect on August 13, 2016.

Short-term rentals refer to leasing or renting a residential dwelling unit (in whole or in part) for 31 days or fewer. The most common types of short-term rentals are vacation rentals and home-sharing rentals, which are now both prohibited. City-approved and permitted hotels located in commercially zoned areas are not considered short-term rentals under the ordinance.

The ban strives to protect residential neighborhoods from the noise, nuisances, added traffic and other adverse factors that can arise with short-term rentals. Appropriate measures will be taken against those who violate the City ordinance. ■

## Street improvements under way

All American Asphalt of Corona was recently awarded a \$628,171 contract by the City Council to upgrade and rehabilitate Shoemaker Avenue from Artesia Boulevard to 166th Street.

The project entails replacement of sidewalks, curbs, gutters and 18 handicap accessible ramps. The project also consists of installation of striping and raised dots on Towne Center Drive, Park Plaza Drive and segments of Bloomfield Avenue, 183rd Street and Shoemaker Avenue.

The work is scheduled to be completed by late August. ■

## Cerritos Mazda dealership remodel approved

The Cerritos City Council recently approved a proposal by Browning Investments for a major remodel of its existing Mazda dealership located at 18827 Studebaker Road in Cerritos.

The plan calls for an extensive interior and exterior overhaul, including expansion of the existing showroom and service canopy area. Existing landscaping will be refurbished throughout. New palm trees, shrubs and groundcover will be added.

The new look will adopt a more contemporary architectural design, featuring external insulating finishing systems, ceramic tiles and a fresh coat of paint. Black, white and clear metal panels will be added. Overall, exterior improvements will adhere to the Mazda corporate branding design guidelines.

Scheduled to begin in October, work is expected to be completed by summer 2018. ■

## City approves Residential Design Manual

The Cerritos City Council recently approved a manual to serve as a guide for residents when designing and upgrading single-family homes so they can complement existing neighborhoods.

Created to be a tool for homeowners and architects, the Residential Design Manual provides helpful guidelines for room additions, exterior remodels, new residences and replacement residences on existing developed properties.

The manual is divided into the following sections:

- Roof design
- Windows
- Enhanced materials
- Tower elements
- Front porches

- Architectural accents, medallions and light fixtures
- Balconies
- Front doors
- Garage doors
- Eaves/Soffits
- Chimneys
- Exterior composition
- Site design/site conditions
- Utilities/easements
- Plan requirements

Each section features a checklist of written requirements related to residential architectural design and graphics that illustrate what's acceptable and what's not.

## Free emergency response training offered

The Cerritos Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) is offering disaster and emergency training in September.

The class will take place on three consecutive Saturdays – September 2, 9 and 16. Classes will meet from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. in the Cerritos Sheriff's Station/Community Safety Center at 18135 Bloomfield Avenue.

The CERT program is designed to help residents in the event of a disaster or other emergency. Participants receive training in first aid and basic disaster medical operations, light search and rescue, fire safety, and disaster and terrorism management. When emergencies occur, CERT members are able to provide critical support to first responders, give immediate assistance to victims and organize volunteers at a disaster site.

## Metropolitan Water District offers conservation rebate program

Residential and commercial rebates are available for qualifying water-saving devices and measures through the Metropolitan Water District (MWD) conservation rebate program.

Products eligible for rebates include high-efficiency clothes washers, premium high-efficiency toilets, weather-based irrigation controllers, rotating sprinkler nozzles, rain barrels and cisterns and soil moisture sensor systems. Turf removal also qualifies for rebates.

The MWD is a consortium of 26 cities and water districts that provides drinking water to nearly 19 million people in parts of Los Angeles, Orange, San Diego, Riverside, San Bernardino and Ventura counties. ■

## Crimemapping.com offers current crime information

Current crime information is now available on [crimemapping.com](http://crimemapping.com), which posts information obtained from law enforcement agencies throughout the United States.

Users can customize searches, such as a particular type of crime or a specific geographical area, and the site provides a map outlining where that crime has taken place. The site also provides comprehensive statistics about other crimes in a given location.

Residents can also create alerts, which notify them of crimes that occur within two miles of a selected location. The site also offers data on sex offenders and the frequency of crimes by day and time.

## City ordinance regulates use of leaf blowers

Under City ordinance, the use of leaf blowers in any residential area and in commercial areas within 400 feet of any residential area in the City is restricted to the hours of 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturdays and 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Sundays and legal holidays. The City ordinance regulating these hours was designed to protect residents from excessive noise caused by such equipment.

Leaf blowers also should not direct debris onto adjacent parcels or lots. Such debris should be removed and disposed of to prevent dispersion by wind, vandalism or other similar means. Piles of leaves left in the gutters can clog storm drains and cause flooding. In addition, leaves in storm drains decompose and grow bacteria that can travel into the ocean. ■

## Volunteers sought for Civil Grand Jury

The County of Los Angeles Civil Grand Jury Office is seeking well-qualified citizens to volunteer for the 2018-2019 Civil Grand Jury that will be impaneled on Monday, July 2, 2018.

The Civil Grand Jury is virtually a full-time commitment over a period of one year. The deadline to submit the application form is Friday, November 3. To qualify, an applicant must be a citizen of the United States; at least 18 years of age; a resident of Los Angeles County for at least one year; possess sound judgement, fair character and ordinary intelligence; and have a working knowledge of English.

The responsibilities of the Civil Grand Jury include investigating county, city and joint-power agencies and examining carefully and completely the operations of various government agencies within Los Angeles County.

The Civil Grand Jury requires a 30 to 40 hour-per-week commitment and pays \$60 for each full day of service. Participation on the Civil Grand Jury is strictly voluntary. Employers are not obligated to provide participants with time off or to pay their salary when they serve on the Civil Grand Jury.
