The **Asian citrus psyllid** is a tiny pest that spreads a deadly disease called **Huanglongbing** as it feeds off of citrus tree leaves.

Huanglongbing is a deadly citrus disease which produces mottled and yellowed leaves and bitter, green, misshapen fruits.

It has no cure.




Commercially grown California citrus is a **\$7.12 billion**-dollar industry in 2018 according to Citrus Research Board.
