

# UPCOMING SEWER REHABILITATION

## Joint Outfall "F" Units 3 Trunk Sewer Rehabilitation, Phase 1 Project



### Who are we?

The Sanitation Districts of Los Angeles County (Districts) serve the wastewater management needs of about 5.6 million people in Los Angeles County. We own and operate a large network of sewers in 78 cities and treat an average of 520 million gallons of wastewater each day at our 11 wastewater treatment plants.

### What is this project?

This project will involve repairing approximately 4,179 liner feet of an existing sewer in the Cities of Cerritos and Norwalk. The District will rehabilitate the section of sewer with a pipe lining system, which can be installed from a few access pits along the sewer alignment and line inside of the old sewer pipe. The lining work will be less disruptive and can be completed in less time than building a new sewer. At this time the District will repair manholes and structures associated with the above sewer.

### Why is this project needed?

The existing sewer pipe is approximately 50 years old and has deteriorated over time due to normal wear and age.

### Where is the work taking place?

Construction will take place in Alondra Blvd., Gridley Road, E. 166<sup>th</sup> Street, and within the parking lot of the Iron Wood Nine Golf Course, all within the Cities of Cerritos and Norwalk as shown on the map.

### When is the project scheduled?

Construction is tentatively scheduled to take place between October 2019 and July 2020. The Districts have selected Spiniello Infrastructure West, Inc., as the contractor, and they will provide residents with additional notice for working days and hours.

### What can you expect?

While some inconveniences to the public are inevitable, the contractor will make every effort to minimize any inconvenience. Some work will take place during consecutive overnight hours. For your safety, the Districts recommend the public, and especially children, stay away from the construction zone.
